SIGN LAGUAGE GIVES HOPE TO THE CWHI FOR HIGHER STUDIES

s we know that sign language enable the Children with Hearing Impairment (CWHI) to understood any topic so that they can take part in social activities and learning. Sign language not only gives a child voice but it also makes them to understand and plays a crucial role in the social participation. The Government of India is collaborating with researchers

and specialists in CHWHI education to educate sign language interpreters and create symbols for science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) ideas in Indian Sign Language (ISL). This initiative supports the deaf students to achieve Higher Education in STEM.

This is in line with the National Education Policy and the Rights of Persons with Disabilities which calls for inclusive education and respect for local sign languages. NEP talks about the standardization of Indian Sign Language across the country the NCERT to Prepared a National Curriculum Framework and this will ensure to take consultation with expert bodies such as National Institutes of DEPwD. NIOS will develop high-quality modules to teach Indian Sign Language, and to teach other basic subjects using Indian Sign



Language.

To bridge the gap ISLRTC and IMTECH joined the hands and build a network of sign language interpreters with STEM terminology and concepts. To move forward in the country expert prepared specialized digital content to educate the deaf by ISL translated content in STEM under the project Indian Sign language Enable Virtual Laboratory (ISLEVL) under the CSIR's 'JIGYASA'.
