"Mock interview" is a practice interview that simulates a real job interview. It allows candidates to prepare for actual interviews by practicing their responses to common interview questions, improving their communication skills, and receiving constructive feedback. Mock interviews can be conducted by friends, mentors, practical's or career coaches and help candidates gain confidence and refine their presentation before facing potential employers.

On Nov. 20-21, 2024, the Department of Visual Impairment (VI) conducted a mock interview session aimed at preparing students for real-world interview scenarios and preparation for practical exam viva. This initiative provided participants with the opportunity to practice their interviewing skills, receive constructive feedback, and enhance their confidence in professional settings.

Objectives-

- To provide students with practical interview experience.
- To improve communication and presentation skills.
- To offer constructive feedback on performance.
- To build confidence for future job interviews.

Participants-

Interviewees: 05 students from the B.Ed. VI program

Interviewers: Faculty members from the Department of VI, including Sandeep Upadhyay & Mansa Verma

Interview Format-

The mock interviews were structured as follows:

Introduction: Interviewers introduced themselves and explained the format of the interview.

Interview Questions: Each student participated in a 10-15-minute interview, which included a mix of behavioral, situational, and experience-based questions.

Feedback Session: After each interview, interviewers provided immediate feedback on strengths and areas for improvement.

Key Areas of Focus-

Communication Skills: Clarity of speech, body language, and engagement with the interviewers.

Content Knowledge: Understanding of Visual Impairment and relevant teaching methodologies.





Problem-Solving Abilities: Ability to respond to situational questions effectively.

Professionalism: Presentation, punctuality, and overall demeanor during the interview.

Feedback Highlights-

Strengths:

- Many students displayed strong knowledge of Braille and related teaching practices.
- Positive body language and enthusiasm were noted as strong points.
- Several students effectively articulated their experiences and relevant skills.

Areas for Improvement:

- A few students struggled with answering behavioral questions and could benefit from practicing the STAR (Situation, Task, Action, and Result) method.
- Some participants were advised to improve their eye contact, avoid filler words and improve their body language.
- Interviewers encouraged students to prepare specific examples to illustrate their skills and experiences more vividly.

Conclusion-

The mock interview session was a valuable experience for all participants, offering insights into the interview process and enhancing their readiness for future job opportunities in the field of VI. The faculty's constructive feedback provided students with actionable steps for improvement, and many expressed gratitude for the opportunity to practice in a supportive environment.


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Report on World Braille Day

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Louis Braille (4 January 1809 – 6 January 1852) was a French educator and inventor of a reading and writing system for use by people who are visually impaired. His system remains virtually unchanged to this day, and is known worldwide simply as braille.

Braille was blinded at the age of three in one eye as a result of an accident with a stitching awl in his father's harness making shop. Consequently, an infection set in and spread to both eyes, resulting in total blindness.^[1] At that time there were not many resources in place for the blind but nevertheless, he excelled in his education and received a scholarship to France's Royal Institute for Blind Youth. While still a student there, he began developing a system of tactile code that could allow blind people to read and write quickly and efficiently. Inspired by the system invented by Charles Barbier, Braille constructed a new method that was more compact and lent itself to a range of uses, including music. He presented his work to his peers for the first time in 1824.

In adulthood, Louis Braille served as a professor at the Institute and had an avocation as a musician, but he largely spent the remainder of his life refining and extending his system. It went unused by most educators for many years after his death, but posterity has recognized braille as a revolutionary invention, and it has been adapted for use in languages worldwide.



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
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Report on World White Cane Day ON 15/10/2024


Today, the students in the institute raised slogans of 'White Cane Day' and expressed their commitment towards the cane, after which Miss Deputy Director told the children about the contribution of the cane. She told that the cane was invented by 'Richard Edwin Hoover' who was an American teacher of mathematics and physical education at the Maryland School for the Blind. He invented the stick in 1945 after the Second World War to support the lives of soldiers who became blind during the war. Focusing on the theme of the day on October 15, 2024, an awareness program about White Cane Safety Day was organized at Ashtavakra Rehabilitation Science and Research Institute, Madhuban Chowk Rohini-85. The organization of World White Cane Day reminds of the constant need for accessibility and equality. In this sequence, all the teachers practiced the cane and the ways of walking in their words, how a visually impairment person can do his work with the help of a cane.

LOUIS BRAILLE DAY was celebrated by students of A.I.R.S.R.ROHINI on **04th jan 2024** at conference room of our ASHTAVKRA INSTITUTE. LOUIS BRAILLE was born on 04th JAN 1809 in Coupvray, France. His system is globally accepted code for those with visual impairment. The world Braille Day was organized by visual Impairment and Deafblindness department

Sandeep Upadhyay Massage : Braille was helped by Haüy's books, but he also despaired over their lack of depth: the amount of information retained in such books was necessarily minor. Because the raised letters were made in a complex artisanal process using wet paper pressed against copper wire, the children could not hope to "write" by themselves. So that the young Louis could send letters back home, Simon-René provided him with an alphabet made from bits of thick leather. It was a slow and cumbersome process, but the boy could at least trace the letters' outlines and write his first sentences.
