







Opening Remarks by Mrs. Sanjana Mittal, Deputy Director of Ashtavakra Institute of Rehabilitation Sciences and Research




Mr. Shivendra Narayan Dubey Delivering his Lecture Understanding ASD and its Primary Intervention Jorm Gargia USA




Dr. Aprajita Clinical Psychologist "Understanding the Development of Children and Adolescents."




Day 2 (29.08.2025) Inaugural Session





Inaugural Session


